Farmers and Businesses Step Up for Turkey Drive 2020 – Same Mission, New Venues

The mission remains the same, but this year the days and locations of Second Harvest's Turkey Drive presented by Lamb Weston will be different.

"The need is greater than ever, and fortunately it's being met by inspiring generosity," said Jason Clark, president and CEO of Second Harvest. "Like everything else, the pandemic is prompting changes to the event, but our goal of providing healthy Thanksgiving meals to families in need remains the same."

The key changes for the fifth annual Turkey Drive, serving the Mid-Columbia and Yakima Valley, are that all three holiday meal box distributions will be on weekdays, and at different venues than last year. Here are the details:

 - o 1,000 families. One box per vehicle

Due to the pandemic, all three distributions will be drive-through, and each vehicle will be limited to one box, while supplies last. The free holiday meal box will include a turkey and all the fixings. No documentation is required.

"While so much has changed this year, one heartwarming constant is the generosity of our partners," said Jean Tucker, a Second Harvest philanthropy manager. "The farmers and business leaders of our region are the ones who make this all possible."

This year's Turkey Drive is presented by Lamb Weston, Tucker noted. Donations are still being accepted, and the first \$5,000 in donations will be matched by our community sponsor, Exponential Ag, LLC.
