Volunteers, Donors make Turkey Drive Possible Thousands of Families will receive hearty Thanksgiving meals

Two hundred volunteers and dozens of donors will make this year's Turkey Drive in the Mid-Columbia and Yakima Valley possible, said Jason Clark, President and CEO of Second Harvest.

"It's so inspirational to see how many people volunteer to help us get ready for the Turkey Drive and distribute the Thanksgiving meals," Clark said. "We couldn't do it without them."

Volunteers help Second Harvest's staff in Pasco put together the 35-40-pound boxes of food that include a turkey and all the fixings of a hearty Thanksgiving meal, and volunteers also are crucial at the distribution sites as well.

Lamb Weston is again the presenting sponsor of the event. "Thanksgiving is a time to celebrate family by sharing a meal together and this event helps make that happen for people experiencing food challenges," said Shelby Stoolman, Sr. Director of Communication and Lamb Weston Foundation President. "Lamb Weston is proud to partner with Second Harvest in our mission to end hunger. We are thankful for the work they do in the community."
