Carrying on the tradition of service

Clark Satre (center) congratulates the owners of Helms True Value Hardware on the store's energy-efficient lighting. Energy efficiency upgrades and incentives are common discussion items for Satre and the customers and communities he serves in the Yakima Valley. Serving customers is a three-generation tradition for Clark Satre, Pacific Power's regional community manager based in Yakima. "Collectively, my family has worked 125 years in the electric utility industry - and counting," said Satre, who has contributed 40 of those years. His father ended a long career as president and CEO of Avista, formerly Washington Water Power. His mother worked for that company as a home service adviser, and her father was a hydro plant operator there. Satre chose to work for Pacific Power, first as an engineer before moving on to field management positions in Oregon and Washington. For the past 12 years, Satre has worked with municipalities, businesses and local groups on a wide range of energy-related topics. Increasingly, his discussions focus on energy efficiency projects, and helping customers reduce their electricity use to save on energy costs. "Energy efficiency is a part of nearly every discussion I have with customers - for good reason," Satre said. "Businesses and consumers can save energy and money, and keep their organization or household operating more effectively." When he's not helping to find solutions for customers, Satre enjoys bicycling.
