The Walmart Foundation Awards Over \$680,000 to Washington Non-Profits; Celebrates with "Day of Giving" Across State

Event held at Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital tomorrow at 11 a.m. to honor the great work done by the hospital with \$66,826 in funding

YAKIMA, Wash. (June 24, 2015)—Tomorrow, the Walmart Foundation will host a "Day of Giving" in Washington to celebrate awarding \$683,034 to 13 Washington non-profit organizations—including a \$66,826 grant to the Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation. Walmart will host three events across Washington to bring together these community leaders and store associates in celebration.

In Yakima, Walmart will honor the Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation in a brief ceremony on Thursday, June 25, from 11-11:30 a.m. at the Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital's employee garden—located behind the Maternal Health Services Building on the hospital campus (2811 Tieton Dr, Yakima, 98902).

The \$66,826 grant will support the hospital foundation's preventative health programs, which aim to reduce the instance of diabetes and childhood obesity in Yakima County by improving food literacy and access to exercise programs. Funds will be used to augment current program offerings, such as yoga, Zumba®, fitness boot camps, and healthy eating cooking classes and grocery store tours.

"This grant will provide area families with the skills they need to make better health choices—something that can impact their health for generations," said Bertha Lopez, senior director of community health. "The Healthy Communities, One Person at a Time program is a critical component of our efforts to address the obesity epidemic in Yakima, and will help us prevent type 2 diabetes and other chronic health conditions through nutrition counseling.."

This grant is a continuation of Walmart's partnership with the hospital and its foundation. The hospital has also received funding through the Children's Miracle Network—which raises funds in Walmart stores—and through partnering with local stores on issues, such as car seat safety.

"Walmart is committed to helping our friends and neighbors live better," said Matti Havener, vice president and regional general manager for Walmart. "This partnership with the Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation helps us do just that. There is nothing more important than our health. We are proud to support their efforts to make healthy living choices easier to make and fun to participate in."
