On October 7, 2017, 200+ volunteers from all three clubs and throughout the community come together in a city-wide effort to collect food to be distributed to local food banks. Volunteers drive through the neighborhoods collecting non-perishable food left on the porch. Everyone wishing to participate needs to leave food items in a plastic or paper bag on their porch for easy pick up by volunteers. Food needs to be placed by 9am for pick-up between 9am and Noon on Saturday, October 7th.

Area businesses are also participating to collect cash donations and food items in the weeks leading up to the official collection day. Those wishing to get involved can contact Yakima Rotary for more details.
