Hospital Award Honors City of Yakima Water Division for Promoting Public Health with Clean Water

Diane Patterson, Virginia Mason Memorial's chief operating officer, presented an award on behalf of the hospital in "grateful appreciation" to the city of Yakima Public Works Department Water Division at the Yakima City Council meeting on Tuesday, June 5.

"We are very blessed as a community to have a Water Division with employees who are so dedicated to providing high-quality fluoridated water that helps improve the oral health and overall health of every resident," Patterson said. In addition to her position at the hospital, Patterson is a board member of Arcora Foundation, the foundation of non-profit Delta Dental of Washington.

The presentation was a follow-up to a tour by City Council and others of Yakima's Naches Water Treatment Plant in conjunction with National Drinking Water Week May 6-12.

Yakima City Council Member Carmen Mendez said the hard work of Water Division employees ensures local residents can get high quality water every time they turn on their faucets.

"It's important we don't take for granted that Water Division employees provide a vital service in making sure healthy water is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year," said Mendez, who is also a member of the Arcora Foundation Board. "I want to thank Virginia Mason Memorial for taking the time to publicly recognize their work."
